

ARTICLE I – PUBLIC PEACE AND ORDER

SECTION ONE – Public Peace and Order

No person shall participate in a disorderly assemblage within the village.

SECTION TWO – Disturbing the Peace

No Person or persons shall:

- a. Act in a disorderly manner or disturb the peace and quiet of the village or any meeting or assemblage therein; or
- b. Obstruct vehicular or pedestrian traffic; or
- c. Congregate with other persons in a public place and refuse to comply with a lawful order of the police to disperse; or
- d. In a public place uses obscene or abusive language or gesture.

SECTION THREE – Malicious Mischief

No person or persons shall willfully or maliciously break or deface any public or private property within the village.

SECTION FOUR – Conduct at Fires and Emergencies

No person shall be guilty of insubordination or disorderly conduct at fires and other emergencies or obstruct, willfully neglect or refuses to obey the orders of the officers of the fire department or emergency personnel.

SECTION FIVE – Firearms

No person shall discharge any firearm within the limits of the village except as may be permitted by the board of trustees.

PENALTY:

- A violation of this ordinance shall be punishable by a fine of not less than one hundred fifty nor more than five hundred dollars.

ARTICLE II - EQUAL RIGHTS AND OPPORTUNITIES

SECTION ONE

No person, corporation or other legally recognized entity within corporation limits of the village shall discriminate against any person(s) race, color, religion, sex, marital status or sexual orientation.

PENALTY

A penalty of not less than \$50 or more than \$250 is hereby prescribed for each violation of this ordinance.

ARTICLE III – PUBLIC SAFETY

SECTION ONE – Amusements

No person shall engage in any act, amusement or practice, endangering property or persons within the village.

SECTION TWO – Sidewalks

No person shall ride a bicycle, skateboard, skates, electric or motorized vehicle (with the exception of motorized wheelchairs) or any other mechanical vehicle on the sidewalks of the east and west side of North Main Street from its intersection with Saxon Drive and West University Street on the south end to its intersection with Pine Streets on the north end.

PENALTY – A penalty of not less than twenty five dollars (\$25.00) nor exceeding two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00) is hereby prescribed for each violation of the sections 1 and 2 of this ordinance.

ARTICLE IV – STREETS

SECTION ONE – Encumbering the Streets

No person shall encumber any street, sidewalk or public ground with any material, nor have thereon any horse, team, automobile, truck or other vehicle so as to obstruct the passage is said street except as may be permitted by proper regulations fixed by the board of trustees.

SECTION TWO – Encroachments

No encroachments or projection in, over, or upon any of the streets or public grounds, or any excavations on or immediately adjacent thereto shall be permitted except by proper regulations fixed by the board of trustees.

SECTION THREE – Obstruction

Every owner or occupant of a plot or parcel of land bounded by any street shall cause all hedges, trees, shrubs or other vegetation shall be kept trimmed in such a manner, that the said hedges, trees, shrubs or vegetation, walls or walks will not (a) encroach over the property line of any street or of Village property in such manner as to interfere with or annoy the pedestrians or others lawfully using such street or property, (b) obstruct the light from the street lights or (c) obstruct the view approaching traffic on intersection streets, or (d) obstruct the street or property in such a manner so as to hinder the removal of snow, or other materials, or the repair of any street or property. Tree branches which project over any street or sidewalks shall be trimmed so that no branch will be less than fourteen feet from the ground. When notified by the Village of a violation of sections 1, 2 or 3 of this ordinance, the notified person shall cause the removal of such violation forthwith. In the event that any of the above conditions exist after ten (10) days notice by the Village, a summons may be issued and the village may trim said trees, or hedges, etc, or remove said walls or walks, and charge the cost of such trimming or removal to the taxes of the premises.

SECTION FOUR – Poles, Wires, and Signs

No utility pole or signs shall be erected nor may any wire or signs strung within the Village except as be permitted by proper regulations of the board of trustees.

SECTION FIVE – Moving of Structures

No person or persons or corporations shall move or cause to be moved any building or structure within the corporate limits of the village without first gaining approval from the Village of Alfred Board of Trustee's and obtaining any and all permits necessary to move the said building or structure. For said approval information supplied to the Village of Alfred Board of Trustee's shall include the size of the building or structure, the routes along the village streets, and the time of the day that the building or structure is to be moved.

PENALTY – A penalty of not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) nor more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) is prescribed for each violation of sections 1 – 5 of this ordinance. Violations shall constitute disorderly conduct and the person violating the same shall be a disorderly person.

ARTICLE V – SIDEWALKS

SECTION ONE – Construction, Repair and Maintenance

The Village of Alfred shall direct the construction, repair, and maintenance of all sidewalks within the corporation limits.

SECTION TWO – Snow Removal

Village residents or property owners have the primary responsibility for keeping the sidewalks on the border of their property clear of snow and ice. During normal work hours the Village crew will remove snow from the sidewalks, but only after their primary job of keeping the streets clear is complete.

PENALTY – If residents or property owners fail to remove further accumulations of snow and ice from the Village sidewalks that border the property in which they reside, they will receive a notice from the Village and will be given twenty-four hours to correct the violation.

If, after twenty-four hours from notice, the violation is not corrected a fine of not less not less than twenty five dollars (\$25.00) and not exceeding two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00) is hereby prescribed for the violation and such violation shall constitute disorderly conduct and any person violating the same shall be a disorderly person.

In addition, after twenty-four hours from notice, the Village of Alfred may direct the foreman of the streets department to have the accumulated snow and ice removed and bill the property owner for the costs of such removal.

ARTICLE VII – PARKING METERS

SECTION ONE – Definitions

Parking meters zones as here in referred to shall mean the portions of streets described and established in this ordinance as zones within which the parking of vehicles shall be controlled, regulated and inspected with the aid of timing devices or meters, hereinafter refereed to as parking meter or meters.

SECTION TWO – Parking Meter Zones

The following streets and portions of Streets are hereby established as parking meter zone:

- (1) On the south side of West University Street, commencing 50 feet from the west line of South Main Street to a point 318 feet west thereof.
- (2) On the west side of North Main Street from the north line of West University Street to the south line of Church Street.
- (3) On the west side of North Main Street from the north line Church Street to a point 67 feet thereof.
- (4) On the west side of North Main Street, commencing 182 feet from the north line of Church Street – north for a distance of 57 feet.
- (5) On the east side of North Main Street commencing at the north line of Saxon Drive for a distance of 63 feet and from the north line of to the south line of the Alfred University Physical Plant / Carnegie Hall access alley.
- (6) On the east side of North Main Street commencing 67 feet from the north line of the Alfred University Physical Plant / Carnegie Hall access alley for a distance of 280 feet – north.
- (7) On the south side of Church Street from the west line of North Main Street to the east line of the business block alley and from the west line of the business block alley to the east line of Mill Street.
- (8) On the north side of Church Street from the west line of North Main Street to the east line of Elm Street.
- (9) On the north side of West University Street from May 1st to October 31st of each year, from a point commencing at the west line of the business block for a distance of two hundred ten (210) feet in a westerly direction.
- (10) In the municipal lot except for those spaces marked in accordance with local law 94-3 Regulation of Parking of Motor Vehicles on Private Places.

SECTION THREE – Installation

- A. The Superintendent of Public Works is hereby authorized and directed to install meters in all parking meter zones hereby established or hereafter established by the Board of Trustees for the purpose of and in such numbers and in such places as in his judgment may be necessary for the regulation, control and inspection of the parking of vehicles therein, and may use single or dual meters.
- B. Parking meters installed in parking meter zones shall be installed upon the curb immediately adjacent to the individual parking spaces herein after described, and

each parking meter shall be so constructed and adjusted to show when properly operated a signal that the space adjacent to which it is installed is or is not legally in use.

- C. The Superintendent of Public Works shall have lines or markings painted upon the curb or street adjacent to each parking meter, designating the parking space in which such parking meter is to be used, and each vehicle parked adjacent to any parking meter shall park within said lines or markings and it shall be unlawful to park any vehicle across any such line or marking or to park a vehicle across any such line or marking or to park a vehicle in such position that it not be entirely within the space designated by such lines or markings. All parking meter spaces shall be so marked that vehicles will be required to park parallel with the curb or edge of the pavement on any state highway and so that no vehicle will be required to park in violation of Section 86.7 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law.

SECTION FOUR – Metered Hours

- A. The parking meters installed in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance shall be used and the time limits hereinafter provided shall be effective between the hours of 9:00 a.m. – 11:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. - 5:00 p.m. (prevailing time) exception Saturdays, Sundays, and all holidays as designated by the federal, state and local government.
- B. No person shall park at any time in any space in which a parking meter is installed, during any time in which the meter is showing a signal indicating that such space is illegally in use, other than such time as is necessary to operate the meter to show legal parking, between the hours of 9:00 a.m. – 11:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. - 5:00 p.m. (prevailing time) exception Saturdays, Sundays, and all holidays as designated by the Federal, State and Local government.

SECTION FIVE – Types of Meters

- A. Parking meters shall be for a period of sixty minutes for each twenty five cent coin, or thirty minutes for each ten cent coin deposited in said meter, to and including a period of one hundred and twenty minutes. Payment of money for the above periods of time shall be paid for in those areas where parking meters of this type have been established.

and when installed and properly operated shall be so adjusted as to permit legal parking:

- B. The parking meters will be installed in the below areas:
- 1) Main Street
 - 2) Church Street
 - 3) West University Street
 - a) On the north side of West University Street between North Main Street and Mill Street, from November 1st through April 30th of each year, parking meters will be replaced with no parking signs for snow removal purposes.
 - 4) Municipal Lot

SECTION SIX – Tampering

- A. It shall be unlawful to deposit or cause to be deposited in any parking meter, any slug, device or metallic substance for any appropriate coin of the United States of America.

- B. It shall be unlawful for any unauthorized person to open or for any unauthorized person to open or for any persons to deface, injure, tamper with, or willfully break or destroy any parking meter installed pursuant to his ordinance.

SECTION SEVEN – Collections

The village clerk-treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to collect or to designate some person or persons to make regular collections of money deposited in said parking meters and to count the said money and to deposit the same and expend the as required by law or as provided for in any contract heretofore or hereafter made and entered into between the village any company or companies, firm or individual manufacturing and selling parking maters to the village.

SECTION EIGHT – Enforcement

It shall be the duty of the police officers of the Village of Alfred to report to the Village Court Clerk of the Village of Alfred for appropriate action:

- A. The number of each parking meter which indicated that the vehicle occupying the parking space adjacent to such meter is or has been parked in violation of any provisions of this ordinance.
- B. The state license number of such vehicle.
- C. Any further facts relating to such violation.
- D. The police officers observing such violation shall also attach to such vehicle a notice to the owner or operators thereof that such vehicle has been parked in violation of the provisions of amendments and additions thereof. Each such owner or operator may within 15 days of the time when such notice was attached to such vehicle pay or arrange payment to be made to the Village Court Clerk during regular office hours if full satisfaction of such violation the sum of seven dollars (\$7) in lieu thereof, deposit the sum of seven dollars (\$7) in the envelope which is a part of the notice attached to said vehicle and mail it to the Village Court Clerk of the Village of Alfred at Alfred, NY. The failure of such owner or operator to make such payments as hereinbefore stated within the said Village of Alfred at Alfred, N.Y., or also in lieu thereof deposit the said sum of seven dollars (\$7) in the said envelope which is part of the notice attached to said vehicle and mail it to the Village Court Clerk of the Village of Alfred at Alfred, NY.

PENALTY

- Any person, firm, or corporation violating provisions of Subdivision 8 of the parking meter ordinance of the Village of Alfred known as Article VII will be issued a parking ticket in accordance with subdivision 8D of this Article.
- Any person, firm or corporation who shall violate any other provision of the parking meter ordinance of the Village of Alfred and the amendments and additions thereof may upon conviction be punished for the first offense by a fine of not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100.00) or by imprisonment for a term not exceeding 6 months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

ARTICLE X – ANTI LITTERING & DUMPING OF REFUSE AND TRASH

SECTION ONE – Definitions

The following words and phrases shall have the meaning ascribed to them below, all other words and phrases shall have the meaning normally ascribed to them unless a contrary meaning is clearly apparent from the content.

- a. Person: Any individual, partnership, corporation or unincorporated association.
- b. Litter: Any and all discarded material including ashes, garbage, paper, empty containers, rubbish and refuse.
- c. Dump: A rubbish heap
- d. Public Place: Any highway road, street, avenue, alley, park, playground, public parking area, public driveway or any property under the ownership or control of the Village of Alfred or any property open to and/or serving the general public.
- e. Village: corporation boundary limits of the Village of Alfred.

SECTION TWO – Casting Litter

No person shall litter, sweep, throw or direct, suffer or permit any servant, agent, or employee, or any person under his control, to litter, sweep, throw or cast any litter in or upon any street, public place, vacant lot or area within the village.

SECTION THREE – Dumping

No person shall dump or cause to be dumped within the corporation limits any refuse or trash, including material from the demolition of buildings, without specific permission from the board of trustees.

SECTION FOUR – Obligation of Property Owner, Lessee, Tenant or Occupant

The owner, lessee, tenant or occupant or person in charge of any building or premises shall keep and cause to be kept the sidewalk and all area abutting the building or premises free from obstruction, nuisance, and any and all litter.

PENALTY

Any person who violates this ordinance shall be compelled to remove said refuse, trash, or materials and shall suffer a penalty of not less the fifty dollars (\$50.00) nor more than two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00) and such violation shall constitute disorderly conduct and the person violating the same shall be a disorderly person.
